

Accessibility for Online Meeting Platforms

Subtitles and Captioning

The Royal National Institute for Deaf People (RNID) estimates that in the UK there are almost nine million hearing impaired people. Approximately 28% of people who are hearing impaired are between 16-60 years of age, and 72% are over 60 years of age. So subtitles/captioning are crucial for a significant number of people and need to be viewed as essential not an optional extra. They are also helpful for people who may be joining from an environment where there may be a lot of background noise.
