

We are excited to offer this new course to **inspire and empower chaplains** in their crucial work. Dive into the science behind pastoral ministry and explore the complexities of dealing with trauma in this carefully designed learning experience which is delivered live online.

The training explores Christian approaches to human flourishing in mind, body and spirit. The aim is to help chaplains deepen the support they offer from theological, scientific and practical perspectives. Key topics will include loss and trauma, why storytelling leads to healing and how to feel confident in the unique value of chaplaincy in a multi-disciplinary setting.

The training will be delivered as a virtual gathering via Zoom. Each two-hour session will include professionally recorded teaching videos, reflective exercises, small group discussion and larger group feedback. It will be delivered by expert facilitators and trainers to ensure the highest possible standard.

Chad Foundations

Saturday 14th September

Held on seven Saturdays which are in person teaching days, (14th Sept, 19th Oct, 23rd Nov, 18th Jan, 8th Feb, 30th April, 14th June) and eight Wednesday Zoom tutorials over an academic year. This is a full



programme of study designed to enable participants to explore a range of different aspects of ministry in the Church of England, alongside the discernment process for Reader ministry. Tutors and speakers include Clergy, Readers and other lay ministers from the diocese. The modules cover: Discipleship, Mission & Evangelism, Pastoral Theology, Biblical Studies, Christian Faith, Worship & Liturgy and Vocation. There is no formal assessment or academic award. In addition to the taught sessions the programme requires a firm commitment to study and reflective work of about 3 hours a week and the support of a parish mentor. Most of the content is delivered on the diocesan Moodle site, an online learning platform.

The programme is tailored to those exploring Reader ministry but is a foundational year for anyone wishing to develop their wider understanding of ministry in the Church of England. It is therefore also suitable for those looking towards Local Commissioning. Participants are *only* accepted with the support of their Incumbent and PCC.

Is there a purpose to the universe? If God is good, why does evil exist? Why do the innocent suffer? What is my place in the world? Life in a complex world forces us to confront big questions, many of which have a direct relationship to faith and our spiritual life. In this workshop, Martin Little will help us discover how we can we preach about the big questions so that our congregations can find the confidence to face and explore them for themselves and discuss them with others - even if there is no clear, easy answer.

This workshop will be led by The Revd Martin Little, Vicar of St John the Evangelist in the town of Highbridge, a small church in an area of significant social deprivation within the beautiful county of Somerset. Martin studied History of Art at The University of Edinburgh, and completed an MA in Theology, Ministry, and Mission at Cranmer Hall in Durham in 2017, where he was taught by the biblical scholar Professor Walter Moberly and The Revd Dr Kate Bruce. After a short-lived stint in banking, he spent ten years in youth and music ministry before ordination in the Church of England. Together with The Revd Jo Stobart, Martin is part of the initiative Grass Roots Theology, bringing free open-access theology days to locations around Somerset.

The rural church faces new challenges and new opportunities, and will be enriched by a creative and entrepreneurial approach to leadership.

The programme develops Christian leadership through engagement with leadership theory, theological reflection and practical leadership issues including conflict resolution, team building and group dynamics, collaboration between lay and ordained leaders, and the importance of deepening emotional intelligence.



Luke's Gospel opens with Luke's claim to have carefully researched the information that he sets out. What does Luke mean when he says this, and how relevant is it to our preaching from his Gospel? Luke presents us with much that is familiar - the nativity story, the parable of the Good Samaritan, the story of Mary, sitting at Jesus' feet, while Martha is busy with household tasks, the parable of the Prodigal Son, Jesus' words from the cross to the penitent thief. This workshop will look at how we can use what is familiar (and what is less familiar) in Luke's Gospel to go more deeply into the themes that Luke highlights, such as concern for the outsider. This workshop will also consider those elements that Luke's Gospel shares with the other synoptics, and what is unique to Luke's account of Jesus' life, and how we can address these similarities and differences in our preaching.

The workshop will be led by the Revd Dr Neil Richardson, Methodist minister and former President of the British Methodist Conference, in which role he co-signed with Rowan Williams the Anglican-Methodist Covenant for Unity. Neil is a New Testament scholar, and former Principal of Wesley College, Bristol. He is the author of several works, including *Love Answering Love: Praying Through the Bible.*





A formation-focused course for clergy and ministers of the West Midlands who want to develop their leadership in changing situations.

'Developing Ministry' focuses on formational development for ordained ministers in positions of primary responsibility. The course explores the dynamics of being a fruitful and godly Christian leader, viewed from practical, personal and theological perspectives.

'Developing Ministry' is particularly designed for those who are in the early years of their first post of primary responsibility. However, clergy at other stages of ministry also find it stimulating, refreshing and helpful.

'Developing Ministry' includes a blend of expert input, theological & practical reflection, and in-depth reflection in small groups. The small 'Reflective Practice Groups' lie at the heart of this course and continue to meet (either in person or online) between the residentials.

The course is structured around three residentials which are held in the attractive surroundings of the Stratford Manor Hotel, near Stratford on Avon.

'Developing Ministry' is hosted by the Rev'd Roger Latham of Worcester Diocese and the Rev'd Rob Harrison of Coventry Diocese, with additional input from specialist external speakers.

Transforming Conflict 2024

23rd - 24th October & 20th November 2024



'Transforming Ministry in a Changing Church'

A course for (post-curacy) clergy of the West Midlands who want to transform their handling of conflict in their parish(es) or ministerial contexts

The archbishops have called on us to re-imagine ministry. Reducing numbers of stipendiary clergy are leading to changed patterns of ministry, with the majority of stipendiary clergy now responsible for more than one church or parish. Collaboration with lay leaders, self-supporting ministers and other licensed or authorised ministers has become a more important aspect of leadership within the parish. The expectations of the laity within our parishes are sometimes unchanged as are the expectations of the local community. All this and many other factors of parish life, such as buildings, can lead us to situations of conflict.

This course offers an opportunity to look at conflict in the church differently. Participants will develop skills that enable them to engage with difficult behaviours, heightened emotions and conflict. The skills will encourage participants to respond authentically, building confidence and ability. Tools and skills will be practical; each participant will be encouraged to identify how they will apply what they have learned in the relationships within their context.

The course will be hosted and led by Sandra Cobbin.

Who is it for?

This course is for clergy and ministers of the West Midlands. It is part of a suite of three courses dealing with power, conflict, and change, and may be taken at any stage of licensed ministry. Whilst many people choose to take all three courses, each of the three is a standalone course and may be taken on its own.
