We're delighted to highlight a new gathering from the Methodist Church, in collaboration with The Arthur Rank Centre, to inspire and support rural church leaders across denominations. This course brings together leaders who are passionate about reaching out to their communities, nurturing faith, and working together in mission within the unique challenges and opportunities of rural contexts. Through six sessions, each two hours long, we'll explore practical and creative approaches to mission that are rooted in rural life. Our aim is to support and encourage leaders in living out their calling, cultivating growth, and building confidence in the rural church.

Topics include:

- Spotting God at work
- Engaging with the agricultural community
- Addressing the realities of rural life
- Creating intergenerational mission opportunities
- Developing rooted discipleship in rural contexts
- Participating in rural festivals

The course will:

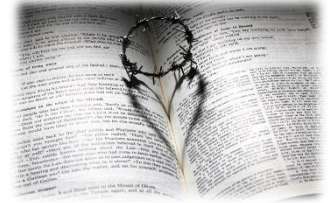

Living Faith Course

Begins Monday 13 January



Living Faith is a one-year, thirty week study programme, spread across three terms; Michaelmas (Autumn) Lent (Spring) and Trinity (Summer). It is designed for groups who would like to deepen their understanding of Christian teaching, and to reflect on what it means to have a 'living faith'.

The course follows the pattern of the Christian year, exploring a range of themes by studying passages from the Bible, drawing from Christian teaching and from the contemporary world. Living Faith aims to encourage people to be more confident in the gospel and to be excited about God at work in the world around them. Group discussion is a key element and successful completion of the full year's programme leads to a Bishop's Certificate. There is no assessed written work. Some evenings include a Film Night and shared meal. The emphasis is on exploring and journeying through the year together as learning companions.

College of Preachers: 'Preaching at Baptisms'

Tuesday 14 January



Christians understand the act of baptism to be a profound moment of change – the point at which one not only becomes part of the Church, but is also made one with Christ. Even for those who are Christian believers and regular church attenders, this can be a difficult concept to grasp. Those attending the ceremony of baptism, often not regular churchgoers, may have little or even no understanding of the spiritual significance of the rite they are witnessing. In this workshop, we will explore ways to communicate the meaning of baptism, drawing on relevant scriptural passages and the symbols used within the baptism service itself. We will also look at how baptism preaching can be evangelistic, an invitation to those present to start their own journey of faith.

The workshop will be led by the Revd Dr Jennifer Brown. Dr Brown is the Director of Training for the College of Preachers and a parish priest in the Church of England's Oxford Diocese, and has more than a decade's experience as a theological educator.

Diocese of Lichfield Spirituality: 'Soul Food'

Begins Tuesday 14 January



Soul Food – a course for anyone who wants to grow in responsiveness to God. With an awareness of some of the Christian prayer traditions, tutor's journey with participants to develop reflection (noticing the movements of the Spirit), an awareness of personality and prayer, and the use of silence, solitude, the Bible and our imaginations as helps to develop intimacy with God.

This course is about *doing* prayer. So a typical session will include time for prayer (using different ways of praying), personal reflection and listening to one another, as well as some teaching from the front. There won't be long essays to write; the 'homework' is to spend some time each day praying. There is no entrance requirement for this course other than a desire to grow in prayer. This is likely to be expressed in:

- A willingness to talk about your prayer life;
- A sense of (or desire for) community with other praying people;
- A commitment to attend all the course sessions.

The Chaplain as a First Responder

Supporting Children and Young People with Additional Needs

Most children's and youth workers want to include children of all abilities and needs in what they do, but many struggle to make this a reality. There are many different kinds of additional needs, and each one, each child, needs thinking about and planning for carefully. How can parents, churches, and children's/youth workers not only understand more about the children and young people they are working with, but also change the way they work with them so to be more inclusive and create belonging for all? This training session inspires and equips participants to bring about meaningful change.

Supporting Families

Understanding and supporting, practically and pastorally, families of children and young people with additional needs. This training session provides participants with everything they need to better understand some of the challenges families of children and young people with additional needs encounter, what that experience can be like for them, and how to offer and provide appropriate and informed practical and pastoral support.

Parish Safeguarding Officer Induction This course is run in one 3-hour session via zoom and aims to equip learners with an understanding of their role and induct them into key working practices and relationships. It is primarily for newly appointed PSO's but we welcome expressions of interest from those who have been in post some time and wish to attend as a refresher.

What is Germinate Leadership?

Germinate Leadership is a unique programme for clergy and lay people developing their own leadership style. It fosters a collaborative, ecumenical approach and a culture of continuing personal and professional development.

There is no single way of being a leader and context will always shape the leadership that is required. The Germinate Leadership programme takes seriously the variety of rural contexts in which leadership is exercised and seeks to encourage and enable the development of creative, entrepreneurial and realistic leaders better equipped to engage effectively with local communities and encourage churches to be an effective Christian presence.

The rural church faces new challenges and new opportunities and will be enriched by a creative and entrepreneurial approach to leadership.

How does Germinate Leadership help in ministry?

The programme develops Christian leadership through engagement with leadership theory, theological reflection and practical leadership issues including conflict resolution, team building and group dynamics, collaboration between lay and ordained leaders, and the importance of deepening emotional intelligence.

What are the benefits of Germinate Leadership?

The 15-month programme includes three full-board residentials, and also comprises a 360° leadership appraisal, mentoring and work-shadowing. A variety of learning styles are used, and teaching incorporates wisdom and experience drawn from secular and church leadership spheres. The programme draws on lay and ordained leadership experience from across the denominations.

Over the course of the programme, participants create a portfolio and leadership development plan which encourage reflection on the programme and the setting of ongoing leadership development goals. These form the starting point for a professional dialogue with two senior Christian leaders at the programme's conclusion.

Germinate Leadership is delivered by the Arthur Rank Centre, the national organisation for the rural church.

The programme is overseen by an ecumenical steering group.
