

The Online Difference Course Beginning Wednesday 30 April

The Reconciling Leaders Network (RLN) have brought together leading thinkers and peacemakers to help us think through the divisions we see



in society and equip us to live well together. Together they developed *Difference*, a 5-session course that has equipped many thousands of adults, both in person and online, (both in the UK and internationally) to think wisely about reconciliation, disagreement, tensions in daily life and living well together.

The course is written from a Christian perspective, but speaks to something we all experience and need, we all need connection and we all experience conflict at some level. The course's potential is to equip people to talk about sensitive areas, and importantly help people listen. The broad nature of the course is not being issue based, and the aim is that through reflecting on lived experiences throughout the sessions the participants will be able to bring the pertinent issue at hand into the course. This is how we expect issues at hand such as, political tension, situations of change or differences in Church to be part of it.

At its centre there are three habits; being curious, being present and reimagine. Through practicing the habits, participants explore how they are already part of us as people and how they may be strengthened to help build flourishing relationships. The habits are the thing you come away with, that you build on and put into long-term practice. Through embedding these, they transform how we engage with societal differences, everyday tensions and navigate disagreement.

Difference on Junction:

This course focuses on three habits: Be Curious; Be Present; and Reimagine. In the sessions it does this by reflecting on biblical stories, a recent story and creating space to include how our own story and experiences shape our thinking. These habits can have an impact on our everyday lives and relationships and affect how we relate to people and the life of the communities that we're part off. The content of the sessions is non-issue based because the skills and practices within it are relevant for any difference. It is brilliant but can also be a good stepping stone to get you thinking about differences your faced with in your context. The habits framework set foundations for introducing ways of navigating them, embedding them before engaging directly on a specific issue.



Supporting Families with SEND Children & Young People (Autism) **Thursday 26 June**



Session 1 - How to Include Autistic Children and Young People in Church

Without considered and intentional measures, many aspects of church life can pose challenges for Autistic children and young people. This practical training provides useful advice on how to make church a space where Autistic children and young people can thrive. It urges children's, youth and families workers to be agents of change within both their own ministries and the wider church community, building a better place for accessibility, inclusion, belonging and spiritual development for all.

Areas covered include:

- What Autism is (and isn't!), medical model vs. social model, brain overloads, myth busting etc.
- Barriers experienced by Autistic children and young people in church, including physical, programme and people barriers.
- Reducing or removing these barriers, and who can help.
- How these changes can create belonging for everyone, including stories from Autistic young people, their families, and church children's/youth workers. 10 ways to create belonging.

When thinking about what 'discipleship' might look like, the New Testament tends to be the starting point for our thinking and inquiry. Whether Martha or Bartimaeus, whether Mary Magdalene or the post- Damascus Road Paul, it is generally New Testament figures to whom we go to in such discussion.

How, though, does the Old Testament contribute to such thinking? How might figures from the OT also help shape our understanding about what it might mean to follow God faithfully? What might we learn from Sarah and Joshua, or from Daniel and Deborah?

These sessions consider several OT examples and how they might help us in our own discipleship practice.



What is Germinate Leadership?

Germinate Leadership is a unique programme for clergy and lay people developing their own leadership style. It fosters a collaborative, ecumenical approach and a culture of continuing personal and professional development.

There is no single way of being a leader and context will always shape the leadership that is required. The Germinate Leadership programme takes seriously the variety of rural contexts in which leadership is exercised and seeks to encourage and enable the development of creative, entrepreneurial and realistic leaders better equipped to engage effectively with local communities and encourage churches to be an effective Christian presence.

The rural church faces new challenges and new opportunities and will be enriched by a creative and entrepreneurial approach to leadership.

How does Germinate Leadership help in ministry?

The programme develops Christian leadership through engagement with leadership theory, theological reflection and practical leadership issues including conflict resolution, team building and group dynamics, collaboration between lay and ordained leaders, and the importance of deepening emotional intelligence.

What are the benefits of Germinate Leadership?

The 15-month programme includes three full-board residentials, and also comprises a 360° leadership appraisal, mentoring and work-shadowing. A variety of learning styles are used, and teaching incorporates wisdom and experience drawn from secular and church leadership spheres. The programme draws on lay and ordained leadership experience from across the denominations.

Over the course of the programme, participants create a portfolio and leadership development plan which encourage reflection on the programme and the setting of ongoing leadership development goals. These form the starting point for a professional dialogue with two senior Christian leaders at the programme's conclusion.

Germinate Leadership is delivered by the Arthur Rank Centre, the national organisation for the rural church. The programme is overseen by an ecumenical steering group. Interested, but want to know more?
